Vice President, Government Relations and Public Policy

Marie Therese Dominguez serves as vice president of Government Relations and Public Policy. In this role, Dominguez reports to the Deputy Postmaster General and manages the public policy and legislative strategy and objectives for postal management and operations. She is responsible for the following program areas: Government Relations including federal, state, local and stakeholder relations and Information and Archival programs that include the Library and the Historian's offices.

She brings to the Postal Service 17 years of expertise in private and public sector management and workforce development; political and legislative affairs and policy analysis.



An attorney, Ms. Dominguez was selected and served 8 years in the Clinton administration, as a senior manager. As special assistant to President Clinton for Personnel, Ms. Dominguez was responsible for the placement of executives into 2,300 leadership positions within the federal government. Ms. Dominguez also served as deputy chief of staff and counsel at the Federal Aviation Administration and deputy assistant secretary of the Army for Civil Works (Corps of Engineers).

In the private sector, she has worked as a management consultant and director of Human Capital and Management at Serco, International. Prior to joining the Postal Service, Ms. Dominguez was a partner at FieldWorks LLC, a grassroots and political consulting firm based in Washington, DC where she worked for and advised government, nonprofit organizations and private sector corporations on developing and executing advocacy strategies including campaign management, legislative strategies as well as public affairs and communications.

Ms. Dominguez's family is originally from New Mexico. She is a graduate of Smith College and holds a Juris Doctorate from Villanova Law School.
